Martha Land began a career in education that spans nearly 37 years. During this time, she has served as a teacher, assistant Principal, and Principal in the Winston-Salem Forsyth County School System. In the summer of 1992, Mrs. Land assumed the principal ship of Mt. Tabor High School. She inherited a mediocre athletic program but envisioned what might be. Through a combination of wise decision-making, dedication, vision and leadership, Mrs. Land transformed the average into the elite. Mount Tabor High School has since emerged as one of the finest high schools in North Carolina. Tabor has long been regarded as one of the area's finest academic and artistic high school. U. S. News and World Report identified Mount Tabor High School as one of the top 500 high schools in America.

Under Martha's leadership, Mount Tabor has won 12 state titles, 35 regional championships, two runners-up in 4-A football, 10 Wachovia Cups, and three State Wachovia Cups. The athletic program has become an important part of the growing traditions of Mount Tabor. She believes in the three A's (Academics, Arts, and Athletics) of education rather than just the three R's.

Jordan told Richards of a phenomenal young girl that he had just seen playing basketball in a gym class. I just rolled some balls out, and the rest was history Jordan said. Curious, Richards went to the gym the next day and saw a wiry, wide-eyed girl who was in the process of schooling several classmates in a pick up basketball game. Richards, then the JV girls coach, said he knew instantly that this girl would head straight to varsity. "There was no question about it," Richards said, "I could tell right away that she was very special."
