

Brad Craddock served his entire career in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County School System as a teacher, coach, assistant principal, and principal. Craddock began his career teaching at Atkins Middle School, which, in those days, was in the building that is now home to Winston-Salem Preparatory Academy. Craddock credits Don Golding, who was the principal there, with steering him into administration. After leaving Atkins and teaching at Hanes Middle for a time, he became an assistant principal at Carver High School in 1999. He was there until 2005. From 2005 to 2009, he was the principal of the School of Computer Technology at Atkins Academic & Technology High School. Craddock became the principal of Glenn High School in 2009.

As an administrator Brad was always visible at every home game, each theatre presentation, choral and band performances, academic celebrations and school-wide events. Whether attending as a fan, to support his school's teams, or to support his coaches, there was one constant; he was there and present.

Brad Craddock was voted the 2016-2017 Principal of the Year for the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County School System. What makes Craddock special, said Rodney Bass, the principal at East Forsyth High School, is "his passion for his school and his kids. He eats sleeps and breathes Glenn High School."

In 2018 Brad Craddock partnered with Donald Wyatt, principal of Sedge Garden Elementary to create the Safety Swap Program. The two agreed to take a look at each other's campuses to try and spot anything out of the ordinary or ways to improve upon safety. They looked at arrival times, dismissal times, large movements of students and other general safety protocol on campus of both schools.

His career as an administrator culminated when he was elected to serve on the NCHSAA Board of Directors for the last 6 years of his career. In the 2018-2019 school year he was elected to serve as Vice-President of the Broad, followed by his election to serve as President of the Board for the 2019-2020 school year. This is one of the highest honors that can be bestowed upon a High School administrator in the state of North Carolina. During his tenue as President of the Board he was challenged with guiding the association through the COVID Pandemic.
